Lecture: Leadership in Safety

During the Safety Breakfast of the Governance Code Safety in Construction, Prof. Dr. Jop Groeneweg spoke about effective leadership in safety. Although safety culture has improved considerably over the past decades, he emphasized that the most successful companies in this area meet a number of important criteria:

- Mistakes are inevitable: People make mistakes, so it is smart to prepare for them.
- Context affects behavior: A good, supportive work environment helps prevent mistakes.
- Blaming doesn't help: A blame culture discourages openness. Rather, focus on improving systems.
- Learning is essential: It is important to learn from both successes and mistakes. Involve everyone, from project manager to subcontractors to construction workers.
- How you respond matters: How you handle incidents determines the safety culture. Make sure what you say and do match.

Assassins: the cold winter months

In this column, we highlight the unexpected but influential risks in your work. We call these risks assassins, because the effects only strike when you least expect it - sometimes years later!

Although this winter's frosts have not been too bad, it is important to stay alert even in milder weather. After all, working in the cold without proper protection or PPE can have long-lasting effects on your body. Even if you think you are little affected by the cold, it can cause damage over time.

Winter brings specific hazards in the workplace. We list the main risks and tips for you:

Slipperiness

In winter it is slippery more quickly due to moisture and frost. This ensures that you have less grip on scaffolding and ladders. Make sure your work shoes have sufficient profile and hold on to banisters and railings as much as possible.

Faster fatigue

In the cold, your body uses more energy to keep itself warm. This can cause you to fatigue faster, reducing your concentration and increasing the likelihood of making mistakes.

Problems with blood circulation

Cold can affect your circulation. Your fingers and feet can become cold and numb, which can reduce your grip and motor skills. This can directly affect safety while working.

Stiffer muscles and joints

The cold makes your muscles and joints less flexible. This increases the risk of strains, sprains and other injuries.

How do you reduce the risks?

Dress in layers: This allows you to easily adjust yourself to the temperature. Wool is an excellent choice because it is moisture-wicking and keeps you warm.

Protect your hands and feet: Wear waterproof gloves and bring extra thick socks. Make sure your shoes are well insulated. **Cover your head and neck:** Much of your body heat escapes through your head. A warm hat and scarf are essential to stay warm.

With the right preparation, we'll get through the winter together warm and safe!
